News from Guayaquil, Ecuador

Dearest Friends and Benefactors of Help the Helpless,

We rejoice to be able to share with you the joy of Jesus' Resurrection! It is the news that filled the disciples with joy and amazement; it is the news that resounds today, filling our hearts with joy. In this Jubilee Year, the Year of Hope, our hope is more than ever placed in the Lord. It is He who conquers death and opens for us the gates of eternal life. Evil no longer has the last word. In the end, the Light will shine for those who belong to God and accept His Mercy. They will be relieved and consoled of all their sorrows; they will live happily ever after and will love Love for all eternity.

There are many beautiful souls who suffer in this world. These are the victims of evil that we see every day: young people struggling with drug addiction, families living in fear of assault or extortion by the gangs, parents who are forced to leave their home and flee to protect their children. We see it all. There are so many neglected children, raised by parents who do not know how to love them; so many people exploited in their work, cheated by a system of corruption; so many sick people who are not given the necessary help....

And yet, in our community in Guayaquil where the hardship is rampant, we still celebrate the feast of Easter with joy and hope. We rejoice in every manifestation of the Lord's victory over death. His triumph is not yet visible to all, but it is being realized in the hidden, in the small. You, with your collaboration and generosity, participate in this manifestation of the Lord's victory and love.

We would like to share with you a moving story, a great sorrow which befell our community but which led to a true miracle of grace. One of the former students at our school, Jeremy Olvera, was brutally murdered by the gangs last month. His family was torn apart with grief. His parents did not know where to turn, and his sister was about to leave home and revenge his death with more violence. They found their way to us, and we counseled them in their extreme grief. After much prayer and many tears, they found it in their hearts to forgive their son's murderers. Rather than letting the grief tear them apart, they used it as a way to bind them even stronger together. They allowed the mercy of God to wash over them in their pain. We celebrated Jeremy's funeral in our chapel in Montserrat, and we prayed for the repose of his soul and for peace of mind for his family. Please pray for them, also.

We have one more story to share, a story of hope and celebration. We are so proud that we will be taking a group of young women on a pilgrimage to Europe to visit the most holy sites. They worked and saved for over two years to be able to glorify our Lord through this journey. We will plan to visit Rome, Lourdes, Fatima, Our Lady's House, and many other places. It is a wonderful thing to be able to support these women in their pursuit of the Lord. They have worked so hard to attain this dream, and we are so blessed to see the joy it brings them. It is especially fitting that they are able to achieve this during 2025, the Jubilee Year! All praise to the Lord. May He allow us to continue to see signs of hope and miracles of grace such as these. We will continue to share with you what the Lord allows us to experience.

We've listened to your most commonly asked questions about managing your account, and we've compiled a list of a couple of helpful **tips and tricks** below.

Q: How do I update my payment information for my recurring donations?

1. Log In to Your Account:

Go to helpthehelpless.org

Click the profile button at the top right corner of the homepage. Enter your registered email and password. If you haven't created an account yet, click "Sign Up Now!" and follow the instructions. You may need to verify your email with a code.

2. Access Your Account Settings:

Once logged in, click on the **profile button** again.

Select **My Giving** from the dropdown menu.

3. Update Payment Information:

Scroll down to **Recurring Gifts** and click on the hamburger menu \equiv on the right hand side for the recurring donations you wish to update.

In the window that opens, find Payment Method

Click on the plus sign + to add a new method of payment.

4. Save Changes:

Once your payment details are updated, make sure to **save** the changes. Click the save button at the bottom of the **Secure Payment Information** page, and then click the **Save Gift** button in the bottom left hand corner of the **Recurring Gift** popup window. If desired, you can also edit the date of your recurring payment and/or the frequency (monthly, quarterly, annually).

5. Confirmation:

You should receive a confirmation **email** indicating that your payment information has been updated successfully.

Q: How do I send a letter to my sponsored child or family?

1. Log In to Your Account:

See steps above for assistance in **logging in.**Once logged in, click on the **profile button**Select **Write my Child/Family** from the dropdown menu.

2. Fill out the Submission Form


Once again, you have our thanks for all you do. May Our Lord reward all your efforts and bless you with love. You are always present in our prayers.
