Christmas Special Needs

Ecuador — Chapel Roof Repair — \$2,700

The perpetual adoration chapel at Holy Family School in Playa Prieta is in need of repairs. The chapel roof has deteriorated after years of harsh rains and flooding. It needs to be replaced. Project funds will be used to cover the cost of materials as well as installation.

Ecuador — Furniture for Families — \$4,400

This project will fund the purchase of basic furniture, as well as hygiene necessities, for 20 families in need in Guayaquil. Since many of these families have nothing, we will help provide them with bedframes, mattresses, tables, and chairs.

Ecuador — Christmas Mission — \$4,250

The Sisters in Portoviejo are working to prepare a special Christmas celebration for the girls in the foster home. This celebration would include a Christmas meal, games, prayer, and catechesis. They would also like to purchase gifts for the girls—a shirt, a pair of shoes, some hygiene products, and some sweets.

India — Plumbing Updates — \$6,880

St. Mary's School is in need of plumbing updates to their student bathrooms. The bathrooms are quite run down and are becoming unsanitary to use. This project covers the cost of materials, labor, and installation to update bathrooms for safe student use.

News from Portoviejo, Ecuador

Dear benefactors of this mission work in Ecuador,

Christmas is approaching! Once again, the liturgy invites us to contemplate the mystery of the Incarnate Word, Who was born poor and destitute in a forgotten corner of the earth to the Blessed Virgin Mary and Saint Joseph.

We are very grateful to you for the welcome you have shown to our missionary work and projects. As most of you know, it's been almost three years since we founded this new community in Portoviejo. There are always so many needs, and our hearts would like to be able to assist everything. However, the Lord ensures that with these poor instruments that we are, and with your great generosity, we can work for his Kingdom in the lives of those entrusted to us. This year, you have been sharing with the families and young people with whom we work here in Portoviejo. We are very grateful for the generosity you have shown our missionary work and projects. Thank you for giving of yourselves, giving to others, sharing with the poorest.

In this final stage of the year, the major project we carried out was the VEMJ pastoral event, a weekend activity in August for the evangelization of the youth of Manabí, revitalizing their faith through a Eucharistic and Marian experience. This is the second time we have held this event, and our expectations were exceeded. This year, the number of young people who participated doubled. We had to close the registration period before the scheduled date because all available accommodations on the university campus in Chone, Manabi, were filled. Four hundred young people attended, and we had the collaboration of approximately 100 young and adult volunteers. The young people were very pleased with the reflection workshops, the moments of prayer, and the atmosphere during all the events... Efforts are always worthwhile when you see the experiences the young people gain.

In these months, leading up to the end of the year, we have restarted the catechism course in the parish and the activities with the university students. We are already organizing the activities we want to carry out especially for the Christmas season, for which we ask for prayers. We will prepare Christmas meals with young people for the needy in the Portoviejo Urban Center, and we will visit and make a Christmas celebration for the children in "Hogar de Belen" and to children in the poorer, red-zone areas. We want to bring clothes, games, hygiene products, and gifts for the children.

Thank you very much because it is going to be made, thanks to your generosity.

May God bless you. We place you all in the arms of the Blessed Virgin and Saint Joseph in our small chapel, before the tabernacle. For all of you, our generous friends, we will pray before the nativity scene on Christmas Eve.

We are especially proud of our meetings and activities for married couples. With the help of the Servant Priests of the Home of the Mother, we gather for meetings and discussions with the married couples in the community. During these meetings, we address the difficulties, joys, and challenges of married life, as well as raising children. We also speak about family life in this welcoming atmosphere where everyone can express their opinions, doubts, struggles, dreams, and hopes. We are able to offer activities and supervision for the children during this time, so that all parents are able to come. We are so grateful to our many volunteers who assist us with this.

It is a joy to be able to use this Missionary Center, where so many works of mercy are being carried out and experienced. News from Playa Prieta, Ecuador

To all our friends and benefactors, thank you from the bottom of our hearts on behalf of so many people whose lives you have touched thanks to your prayers, your sacrifices, and your donations. We are writing to you again from Playa Prieta, to thank you for all the spiritual and material help you offer us. We would like to share a short anecdote with you about a missionary, Fr. Christopher, who came to visit us from Mexico. He is a part of the Arroyo Prieto Mission. Christopher was preaching to our students, they decided they wanted to help his mission and implored us to speak to him.
