We are happy to report that St. Mary's is returning to normal. The school looks like a sanctuary, full of singing birds. The children who are studying at St. Mary's are happy and comfortable, and all the children are studying well.

The rainy season has begun, and where we are located in India has become very cool. Due to the heavy rain, several areas of our state are flooded with water, and our district has been deemed a high alert area. All agricultural farm areas around us have been badly affected by the rain.

We are very conscious of the children's health during these cool months. Each day we check the health status of the children and give treatments to those who are affected with cold and fever. If a child is affected with a cold and fever, they are isolated from the other children and provided extra care by the teachers, wardens, and nurses.

Recently the district-level school competitions were held, and our Handicapped and Deaf-Mute children participated. They competed with the normal trained students from the surrounding schools.

News from the Sisters in Chone, Ecuador

Dear friends and benefactors of Help the Helpless,

In this joyful season we send you our Christmas greetings from Ecuador, where Jesus continues to be born by Grace in the souls of so many people. We wish to share with you a wonderful story from the last few months.

Ana Rocio Arroyo is a 49 year old woman we came to know when her brother asked us for help. Ana was very sick and had many needs. We visited Ana and her husband, and tried to help Ana with medicine and food, sponsoring her so that she could receive a monthly basket.

When we visited her at Christmas last year, taking the Child Jesus to her, Ana (who was not baptized) exclaimed: "How nice would it be to belong to the religion of the Child Jesus." With this phrase she expressed her desire to know God and to be baptized, this need of the soul being greater than the needs of the body. Ana began to receive catechesis to be baptized, with the commitment of her and her husband to also receive the Sacrament of Marriage. Both she and her husband attended the catechesis with great attention, kindling in their souls the light of the knowledge of God and the desire to live as good children of God.

As the days approached, Ana got very excited just with the idea of "being God's daughter," and she told us that she repeated this idea to everyone she met, from her family, neighbors, friends, etc.: "I am going to be God's daughter." We had the help of the members of the Home of the Mother to prepare her a baptismal dress and everything necessary for her Baptism, everyone contributing what they could, so that her exterior would represent the great work that was going to take place in Ana's soul.

A party was also prepared to celebrate this great event and so many people, after having been with Ana, came to us full of joy and commented: "Sister, she is so happy to be baptized that her joy is contagious to all of us." Finally, on October 18, Ana was baptized and confirmed by the pastor of our parish San Cayetano. Ana became a daughter of God and a member of His Church! She received the water of baptism with full knowledge of this grace, as well as the fact that God was erasing from her soul every stain of sin. She truly looked like a new person, a reborn soul. The priest urged Ana and her husband to continue preparing to receive the Sacraments of the Eucharist and Marriage, for which they are both preparing with great enthusiasm.

How great is the grace of God. How it dignifies the person. Ana felt as if she were a new creature, and she really was. She could see how this gift of being a daughter of God dignified her as a person and elevated her supernaturally in a surprising way, and that is how she felt.

Could there be a greater gift than this? Day by day the promise of the angel to Joseph continues to be fulfilled: "...and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." (Luke 1:15)

From Chone we send you all our gratitude for helping us materially and spiritually to make possible the work of God in souls and bodies. May the Baby Jesus the Savior and his Most Holy Mother bless you abundantly. Count on our prayers.



An Christmas Message from Father Rafael

Dear HTH Benefactors,

I never grow tired of thanking you for your generosity to The Missionary Groups of the Home of the Mother Order. Every Christmas, in our Western Tradition, we congratulate each other, give each other gifts, and illuminate Christmas lights. Your gifts to us take the form of funding for projects that would not be possible without your cooperation. For our part, we give you the gift of our constant prayer and the expression of our gratitude, especially as we approach this Christmas season, which we will celebrate in communion with the whole Church.



I will now give you a summary of all that we have been able to do this year, thanks to your generosity. These ten realities have been possible because of you:

- 1. We have delivered 11 bamboo cane houses to families in Riochico and Playa Prieta.
- 2. We finished building 6 block houses for families in Flor de Bastión, a very poor area of Guayaquil.
- 3. We gave scholarships to more than 200 children in more than 8 schools.
- 4. We have 198 sponsored families, where without your help, it would be almost impossible for them to survive.
- 5. We have 20 new families of Socio-Vivienda, and Father Lenin, a young and very good priest, has gone to live in this red and dangerous area, plagued by the drug virus, to evangelize and minister to the people there.
- 6. We have been able to pay the volunteers of the soup kitchens, and the families and have been able to open a new soup kitchen in Nueva Prosperina, Guayaquil.
- 7. We have bought and distributed many and varied religious material: crosses, medals, holy cards, scapulars, etc.
- 8. We have been able to distribute university scholarships to 58 young people.
- 9. We have helped to pay the salaries of teachers in Playa Prieta.
- 10. We have been able to distribute medicines to the poor, prescribed by our doctors, and to acquire more medical material necessary for consultations.

Just as there are 10 Commandments of the Law of God, we have been able to verify that these Commandments are summarized in two: "You shall love the Lord your God and your neighbor as yourself." These 10 new realities, made possible by your support, prayers, and donations, manifest the reality of the two Great Commandments made of love and mercy. For all this: Thank you, thank you, thank you! May God bless you and keep you many years in this life so that you may continue to do good.
